A message from Supervisor Williams

Panhandlers have been a growing concern in Canton for



the past couple of years. I receive regular comments and calls to my office asking why the Township is not doing anything about this issue. It is important to understand that panhandling has been determined to be protected speech under the 1st and 14th Amendments to the United States Constitution. As early as 1992, the Supreme Court struck down a regulation prohibiting panhandling in airports. More recently in 2013, the Federal Appeals Court struck down a Michigan statute that criminalized panhandling.

This means that, while many see the panhandlers as a nuisance, Canton cannot force them to leave simply for the act of asking for money in a public place. However, panhandlers cannot impede the flow of traffic, they cannot harass or accost those they are asking for money from, and they cannot be on private property without the property owner's consent. All of these actions are unprotected, and if any panhandlers are caught engaging in these actions, Canton police can take action.

There are formal programs in place to help all individuals and families who have a true need. We have a compassionate community in which I could site many examples of people offering these individuals food, jobs, and shelter. Many times offers have been respectfully declined.

Treasurer Slavens' Corner

Summer is upon us and you should have received your summer tax bill. If you have not, please contact my office. Summer tax payments can be paid through September 14, 2018, without interest or penalty. After this date an interest charge of 1% will be added per month.

There are a variety of ways to pay your property taxes. They include:

- At our 24-hour drop box: Located outside the main entrance of the Canton Administration Building. Please include the bill number or property tax ID number on your check. Please do not submit cash to the drop box.
- At the Treasurer's window: Monday Friday, from 8:30 a.m. 4:30p.m.

 - By mail: Send check/money order to:

We accept cash, personal checks, bank checks, MasterCard, Discover and Visa. There is a \$3.95 charge for debit/credit card use under \$160 and a 2.5% charge for credit card payments over \$160. This charge is levied by the banks.

If you meet the following conditions, you may defer your property taxes, penalty-free, until February 14, 2019.

- 1. Age 62 or older (or the unmarried surviving spouse of a person who was 62 years of age or older at the time of death); eligible serviceperson, eligible veteran, or an eligible widow or widower of a veteran or serviceperson; permanently disabled, blind, paraplegic, quadriplegic, or hemiplegic; AND total household income in the prior taxable year did not exceed \$40,000.
- 2. Property classified or used as agricultural property can also be eligible for deferment under specific conditions.

Please stop by the Treasurer's Office if you meet any of these conditions and we will prepare the Summer Tax Deferment form. You must bring proof of your total household income from 2017 (typically your 1040 form). Forms must be submitted to the Treasurer's Office no later than September 14, 2018.
